Título:\_Comparative study of the discourse of hearing mothers of deaf children. Detection of different moments after being informed about the diagnosis and diverse therapeutic strategies

- **I. Aim**: To study, in six mothers, wishes and defenses, as well as their state, in the moment after being informed about the deafness of their children.
- **II. Sample**: In the six cases (Mónica, Cristina, Amelia, Carla, Susana y Azucena), the narration, during one interview, of the moment after receiving the diagnosis of their faughters' handicap. Additional note: two of the mothers were married but they were in a situation of extreme loneliness; two of them divorced and some years later they found new couples; and, the other two had a stable marriage.
- **III. Method:** David Liberman Algorithm (DLA), which allows to investigate, in the discourse, wishes and defenses, as well as their state.
- **IV. Procedure:** 1) To detect the sequence of wishes and defenses, as well as their state, in each mother in the sequence of moments that follow the acknowledgement of the diagnosis, 2) To compare the results

## V. Analysis:

In the six cases we could detect three different moments in the psychic processing of the diagnosis of deafness in their daughters.

- a. Moment of shock: direct manifestations related to the trauma
- b. Moment of recovery from the shock: first strategies to cope with the shock
- c. Moment of reconnection to reality: acceptance of the diagnosis and global reorganization

In the second and third moments, there is a difference in the psychic processing related to the daughters and to the couples.

The following tables resume the analysis of the wishes (Table 1) and the defenses (Table 2), as well as their dominance (Table 3) in the mothers, in the sequence of moments stated above.

## IV. Conclusions

In the first moment, moment of shock, Monica successfully disavows, Cristina forecloses affection and can use certain defenses in accordance with the goal. Amelia, Carla and Azucena fail to foreclose the affection and Carla y Azucena also fail to disavow. Susana and Azucena can successfully resort to defenses in accordance with the goal and Azucena fails to repress.

In the second and third moments, as we already stated there is a difference in the psychic processing of the trauma in reference to the daughters and to the couples.

Concerning the daughters, in the second moment all the mothers can apply the defenses in accordance with the goal to make the first decisions regarding the treatment they will choose for their deaf children. All of them opt for oralization. They also resort to other defenses such as, disavowal, foreclosure of the affect and repression.

As for the couples, in the second moment, Mónica and Cristina fail to foreclose their affection. Amelia and Carla successfully foreclose the affection and use defenses in accordance with the goal: they divorce. Susana and Azucena strengthen their marriages. Susana successfully represses and, in other situations, fails to repress and disavow. Her husband is involved in the raising of their daughter. Azucena embellishes the situation of her daughter through a successful disavowal.

In the third moment, Mónica finally successfully forecloses her affection, but this defense exposes her to the risk of an organic compromise. Cristina fails to disavow reality and to foreclose her affection and ends feeling that she is victim of professionals that speculate with the treatments. Amelia and Carla, who, at first fail to foreclose the affection, can recur to successful defenses in

accordance with the goal, disavowal and repression, which allow them to develop satisfactory bonds with their deaf children. Susana and Azucena present a great variety of functional defenses and consequently they can successfully cope with reality in an adaptive way through defenses in accordance with the goal: Susana finds an adequate treatment for her daughter and Azucena and all her family learn Argentinian Sign Language.

As for the couples, in the third moment, Monica's husband dies which increases her loneliness and she fails to disavow. Cristina thinks of her husband as a mere butler and also fails to disavow. Amelia and Carla use defenses in accordance with the goal: they find new couples and are able to lead satisfactory lives. Susana and Azucena successfully resort to defenses in accordance with the goal. Azucena successfully disavows because her husband and her, consider the deafness as a gift that permitted them to know other ways of perceiving the world. Susana says that her husband overprotects their daughter, and she is right.

These results allow us to think in which way a psychotherapist can intervene with the mother of a handicapped child, according to the moment of her particular psychic processing of the trauma of the diagnosis.

It seems that not foreclosing the affection in the first moment may lead to a more complex and functional processing in the following stages, that is, to achieve a better bond with their children or, either, to keep and strengthen their marriages or to divorce and build a new family.

When the defenses are more regressive, there is a greater difficulty to cope with the trauma of the diagnosis of the handicap in the daughter and with the unsatisfactory relationship with their husbands. These facts can lead to somatic symptoms or a perception of the reality as speculating or deceiving.

Therefore, these results can be useful to determine the therapeutic goals in the treatment of the mothers. Each moment shows different characteristics that must be considered to be able to establish an empathic therapeutic relationship and to plan an adequate therapeutic strategy, which takes into account the mental condition of the mother regarding both, her daughter and her couple.
